Clarendon Way Walk FAQs

When can we get our t-shirts?

We would like to encourage all participants this year to collect your t-shirts and walker packs before the event.

Packs can be collected from our hospices (Sutton Scotney, Winchester) on the following Wednesdays between 10.00am 4.00pm - May 7th & June 4th. Here is the <u>What Three Word</u> location for the hospices.

You will also be able to collect from our warehouse at Winnal between 9.00am 12.00pm on Saturday 31st May and Saturday 7th June. Here is the <u>What Three Word</u> location for the hospices.

If you are collecting on behalf of your friends, family or colleagues; we need to know their full name and DOB as confirmation. Alternatively, you are welcome to collect your t-shirt and walker pack on the day, however, please notify us in advance if you are choosing this option.

Can we bring our sponsorship money with us to hand in?

Yes of course. You can hand your sponsorship money to our information desk at each of the above starting locations. Please ensure the money is in an envelope clearly marked with your name, walker number and the amount inside.

What if I arrive late and miss check in?

Unfortunately, any latecomers will not be able to take part for health and safety reasons. Please ensure you arrive within the relevant start time for your distance.

Can friends and family come watch?

Yes, spectators are most welcome to come and watch.

Can friends and family sign up on the day?

The 26-mile and the 12-mile walks require training; therefore, it is not recommended to sign up on the day.

If they wish to take part in the 5-mile walk, they can register at Pitton.

Is there food and drink available?

There will be refreshments and snacks available at each of the pitstops.

Please note we will not be providing bottles of water, to keep in line with our sustainability mission. There are refill stations at Broughton Village Hall, Pitton Village Hall and various other venues.

In addition, the Broughton Village Community Shop will be open until 14:30 for you to purchase lunch items, such as sandwiches, sausage rolls and cakes.

Are there toilets?

Toilets are located at each pitstop, except Clarendon Park Estate.

Where can we park?

There is NO bus travel after the walk, we suggest that you park your car in Salisbury and catch the pre-event bus to the start line (Winchester/Broughton), thus meaning your car will be at the finish.

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Suggested Car Park: Salisbury Public Car Parks - Culver St, SP1 2BQ or 41 Brown St, SP1 2AS

If you are do not plan on catching the bus with us, we suggest parking one car at the finish (above car park) and parking another in Winchester. Suggested Car Park: Winchester Public Car Parks - Colebrook St, SO23 3SD or Tower St, SO23 8TA

Please note there may be a small charge for the car parks on a Sunday.

Are there buses?

Please note there will be NO buses after the walk. We suggest that you park your car in Salisbury and catch the pre-event bus to Winchester, thus meaning your car will be at the finish. Bus travel is complementary, however you MUST pre book with us and we are unable to make amends on the day – if you would like to book a bus and haven't already, please contact charlotte.patrick@naomihouse.org.uk

Collection point for both bus journeys is Salisbury Cathedral Walls, SP1 2SF

- Pre-Event Salisbury to Winchester Bus 06:30 (Drop off point: The Broadway, Winchester)
- Pre-Event Salisbury to Broughton Bus 11:30 (Drop off point: The Grey Hound Pub, Broughton)
- Pre-Event Salisbury to Pitton Bus 13:30 (Drop off point: Pitton Village)

Are there changing rooms at the event?

Unfortunately, there are no changing rooms. We advise that you come wearing your t-shirts.

Is there somewhere I can leave my things?

No, and we advise that you travel light for this event.

Can I bring my dog?

Yes, but please keep all dogs on leads and join the back of the group. Please make sure you clear up after your dog and dispose of waste in the appropriate bins.

Who do I contact in an emergency?

We have two emergency numbers for you, please do save these numbers into your phone prior to starting the walk:

- **Primary Emergency Number TBC -** If you have a medical emergency, please use this number.
- Event Emergency Number TBC If you need to report a non-medical emergency, please use this number.

Can I withdraw during the event if I need to?

Yes, of course. If you wish to withdraw from the event, please do so at a pitstop where you will be able to have a refreshment whilst waiting for a lift.

If you drop out during the route, please inform us that you are doing so by texting your name and walker number to **Participant Withdrawal - TBC.**

If I cannot take part, can I give my place to a friend?

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No, unfortunately your place is non-transferable. If you cannot take part, please let us know. Your registration fee will be transferred as a general donation to the charity.

Is the route pushchair/wheelchair friendly?

Unfortunately, not. The route is a countryside walk on a weathered, multi-terrain route, much of which is uphill.

Can we run the route?

No, please do not run the route. If you do so, you will likely miss all the pitstops, as their opening times are based on the speed of walkers. This would mean that you would not be able to receive the rest and refreshments which are vital to this challenge.
